Return to Competition

All Competitions will take place under strict Protocols and Safety Guidelines. Your Officials' Committee along with BC Athletics staff have developed Protocols for each of the Event areas. These were approved by the BCA Board of Directors. No Rule modifications have taken place; however, safety guidelines have been written to ensure that our practices in dealing with all participants in a Competition are clear and provide for health and safety. These guidelines, unfortunately, restrict the numbers of Officials and Volunteers but will still allow results to be valid and all records set by Athletes accepted by accrediting bodies.

It is good practice to build your own PPE Kit to bring with you to any competitions you may attend.

Your PPE Kit should include:

- Face masks
- Those Officials who will be in high-contact positions should also consider having goggles or face shields
- Gloves
- Hand sanitizer
- Disinfectant wipes or spray
- Paper Towels

Note: A list of Health Canada approved hand sanitizers and disinfectants can be found <u>here</u>: Organizing Committees (HOC) will be responsible for sanitizing all equipment to be used by Athletes and Volunteers (including Officials). Officials should be prepared to monitor their involvement and use items from their own kits as is necessary.

New way to judge jumps take-off fouls among recent competition rule changes introduced for 2020-2021

To coincide with the publication of the 2020 edition of the <u>World Athletics Competition & Technical Rules book</u>, we have summarised the key rule changes that have been made in the two years since the 2018 edition of the rules book was published.


Most of these rule changes were approved by the World Athletics Council at meetings in 2018 and 2019 and were introduced from 1 November 2019, and published in the digital version of the <u>Book of Rules</u> at that time. Area and Member Federations are notified of all rule changes directly after the Council meeting at which the decision is made.

One of the significant rule changes that will come into force on 1 November 2021 is with the way take-off fouls are judged in long and triple jumps.

Currently, a no-jump is called if an athlete is judged, while taking off, to have touched the ground beyond the take-off line. A plasticine board set at an angle of 45° has been long used to assist with such decisions. Under the new Technical Rule (number 30.1.1), it will be a failure on take-off if any part of the take-off shoe or foot breaks the vertical plane of

the take-off line. It was felt that this would be more understandable and simpler to judge. The old rule occasionally allowed toecaps to visibly broach the line without marking plasticine. In the future, such moments are to be fouls and the plasticine board, if used, is to be set at 90°.

The change was due to be enforced from 1 November 2020 but in view of this year's exceptional circumstances – and particularly because of the postponement of the Olympic Games to 2021 – it has been delayed for one year.

Ralph Coates by Louise Meville

In Dale Loewen's words, "Ralph Coates was the nicest and kindest man: a man who cared very much for our sport and for the athletes." He was a quiet man who loved a joke and had a good sense of humour.

He was the father of a Richmond Kajaks athlete; he entered the sport as a starter, became a long-time hand timer and worked as an umpire. Starting at the Kajaks club level, then member of the Track and Field Officials for BC, he worked for many years at BCTF meets. He was a starter 'extraordinaire' at the Kajaks-sponsored BC Elementary Track and Field Championships, an open meet attracting thousands of kids from all over the province over the years. You had to have tons of patience to deal with the hundreds of heats and finals run off over the 3 day meet period. As well as starting the events, he had the job of loading all of the starting guns' shells. He would often go to his home near Minoru track at the lunch break and load more shells for the afternoon and evening events. He provided the shells for all of our starting guns for many years at track meets.

Later he became a member of the 'elite old boys' club' hand timers' group, before the days of photo finish cameras, timing with the group of Davy Coupland, Arnold Lucks and Ken Bogas and others. Ralph never said "no" to any request to attend a meet: always interested, available and smiling. He just needed to know where and when.

Ralph was one of the BC Officials chosen to work the 1978 Commonwealth Games in Edmonton as an umpire. He umpired along with other officials from BC and all across Canada, with some international guest umpires as well. His many years as starter, timer earned him that privilege.

The award for long-serving official in our organization is given annually in his name to honour his years of service.
