Check list for Mentors:

Have a meeting with the official **BEFORE** the meet begins

Discuss the official's goals

Go through the Mentoring Form

Talk about how and when the official will be observed

Between events or tasks have a discussion with the official

Take time to have a debriefing session with the official at the completion of the meet

Don't forget to sign the form and the official being mentored must sign

Upon completion of the mentoring, **the mentored official is to receive the original**. The mentor is required to keep a copy and send a copy to the NOC vice Chair - Mentoring.

Mentee must meet all 5 criteria fully.
